For many, many years, Connecticut CPAs have paid the highest license fee in the U.S. And it's not a marginal difference – Connecticut CPAs pay \$565 annually, nearly five times the national average of around \$97 per year.

Further, there is a severe shortage of licensed CPAs both in our state and nationwide. This shortage threatens the availability of licensed, proven professionals to perform vital financial services and protect the public interest. Lowering the financial barriers to licensure will not only make the profession more accessible to a broader range of candidates, but will also assist in retain the talent we already have, helping to ensure the continued availability of high-quality financial services for our citizens and businesses.
